The goal of the assembly line worker is to ensure the part or product assembly is produced "right" the first time and on time, to meet the specifications (acceptance standards) for use in the consumer market. Rather you are hire as a general production worker or an assembly line worker, both jobs offer a great opportunity with career path for an individual with great attendance, attitude, and work ethic!

Key Duties:

- Start assembly and production machinery at beginning of shift
- Monitor equipment to ensure that products are being assembled properly
- Ensure that workstation is clean and free of hazardous materials
- Address concerns with production equipment and machinery and make repairs when necessary
- Ensure equipment is clean at all times
- Observe and removes faulty product parts from assembly line
- Inspect assembled products to ensure they are in line with quality standards
